Reading Corner

Superkids:

These kids love to read. Please encourage them to read books they bring home to you. The more they practice the better and more fluent they will read. Encourage them to read the words, not just interpret the pictures. You can use sticky notes to cover the pictures if it helps. Point to certain words and ask them to decode. They might get to a point where they memorize the page. The goal is to memorize the actual words and not have to decode everytime. Finally, be patient. Learning to read is a process. They are only kindergartners and have a lot of time. The most important thing is for reading to be fun. If it is getting frustrating, take a break. Make mini goals and reward them. If they read for a certain amount of time then they can pick out a book for you to read to them. If they read a certain number of books reward them with a new book.
